## ABOUT NCCM

The National Council of Canadian Muslims (hereafter NCCM) is a prominent non-partisan national organization that has been working to protect and promote the fundamental human rights and civil liberties of Canadian Muslims and other diverse communities for over 17 years. NCCM's work includes the regular monitoring and documentation of hate crimes, and the provision of assistance to victims.

## AREAS OF ACTION

NCCM approaches its human rights and civil liberties mandate by focusing on 4 areas of action:

- Anti-Discrimination Case Work
- Community Education & Outreach
- Public Advocacy
- Media Engagement

NCCM advocates on behalf of Canadian Muslims and others who have experienced discrimination and incidents of hate based on their perceived or actual religion. It offers suggestions and advice to individuals who file complaints with NCCM. NCCM also provides assistance by mediating cases with employers, educators, and public institutions to help resolve complaints and to help avoid what can be costly and time-consuming legal avenues.

NCCM offers a variety of regular seminars and workshops on Islamic practices, anti-discrimination, and media engagement.

It also produces a number of publications, which include guides outlining Islamic religious practices for journalists, employers, educators, and health care providers with plans for the development of additional guides relating to other professions including correctional services and law enforcement. NCCM is also in the process of updating its most popular publication - the "Know Your Rights" pocket guide - to include a section on the duties of citizenship. This new "Know Your Rights & Responsibilities" guide

will be made available in eight languages, including English and French. These publications are regularly requested by government departments, local and national media outlets, police services, hospitals, schools, private firms, and various non-profit groups.

## REPORT OF HATE CRIMES

### ABOUT THIS REPORT

#### **Reports to NCCM & reports in the media**

NCCM is pleased to present its 2017 report to the ODIHR regarding hate incidents. As in previous years, the data in this report includes documented cases of hate crimes or hate incidents reported to NCCM staff as well as those cases reported in the media. The need to monitor Islamophobia and associated hate crimes in Canada is clear and pressing given the the significant increase in police-reported anti-Muslim incidents over the past 5 to 10 years, in addition to more recent spikes following the January 29, 2017 shooting at a Quebec City mosque, and the accompanying rise of far-right extremist voices in the public discourse.

Please note that some incidents are reported both to NCCM and covered in the media. Where a public media report of the incident exists, the incident has been included in this report. The name(s) of victims of individual attacks are only included where the name has already been publicly reported in the media.

#### **Report represents a fraction of actual hate crimes & incidents**

Only a fraction of actual hate crimes and incidents are reported to police authorities and an even smaller percentage are reported to NCCM. When hate crimes or incidents are reported to NCCM, NCCM encourages the victim to also report the incident to police if they have not already done so. NCCM's experience indicates that crimes committed against Canadian Muslim institutions are more frequently reported to authorities than crimes against individuals. It is important to note that based on our anecdotal experience in speaking to community members, there are greater occurrences of anti-

Muslim discrimination than what is reported<sup>1</sup>. Community members report being reluctant to fully share their stories due to a fear of repercussions. Hence, negative experiences often go un-reported and subsequently, unaddressed, leading to self-loathing, apathy and the harmful impacts of these on the overall well-being of Canadian Muslim communities. It is also worth noting that many victims have stated that, when it comes time to report incidents to frontline police officers, they are directly or indirectly discouraged from coming forward, which is contrary to the narrative presented by police. Among the main concerns communicated to NCCM is the lack of empathy shown by case intake officers, as well as inadequacies in fully understanding the cultural sensitivities of the reporting party.

While the outcome(s) of hate crimes and hate incidents investigated by authorities are not always made public, NCCM's general experience is that "minor incidents" (defined as those not involving serious physical injuries or major property damage) receive minimal investigative resources from authorities and very few criminal proceedings are ever actually launched.

Due to the lack of consistent national reporting, the overall figures in this report likely underestimate the actual numbers of anti-Muslim incidents and hate crimes in Canada. Further, this report includes incidents which may not fit the definition of a hate crime according to Canadian criminal law, but that authorities may have investigated and/or classified as 'hate incidents'.

### **Hate Crimes & Hate Incidents**

Many Canadian police services keep data on hate crimes but neglect to keep statistics on hate incidents. Police data is later submitted to Statistics Canada who compiles it and then publishes it on its website. NCCM welcomed Statistics Canada's early release of hate crime data this year. This is a change from the normal two-year gap between when

data is provided to Statistics Canada by reporting police services and the release of the statistics to the public.

It is worth mentioning that data on hate crimes is categorized by police based on various motivating factors which can include ethnicity and religion. However, when recording a hate crime, police are only able to list one motivating factor behind why they believe the incident occurred. This can make accurate recording of religiously-motivated hate crimes difficult due to the presence of intersectional identities, in many cases. For instance, while anti-Muslim hate crimes may have decreased by 20 incidents during 2016 in comparison to 2015, hate crimes motivated by race or ethnicity actually increased. It is possible, however, that a victim's intersectional identity may have played a role in the motivation behind the attack but, given the inability for police to report multiple motivations, that these intersecting reasons may not have been reflected in the data.

For example, within the NCCM online hate map, an incident was recorded whereby a Colombian man and his family were mistaken for being Muslim as a man approached them shouting "ISIS" and "terrorists"<sup>2</sup>. In this way, it is not always easy to distinguish when perpetrators of hate crimes are motivated by a hatred to a particular ethnicity or religion, or due to a connection between these identities (perceived or otherwise). While the attack may have been anti-Muslim in nature, it is unknown whether this attack would have been recorded as a racially or religiously motivated incident.

In other words, while we welcome the early release of these key findings, there is concern that police are at present only able to record one motive for hate crimes, meaning the data may not be as representative of the intersectional realities and identities of our communities as it could be.

The NCCM also continues to advocate for all levels of government to provide additional resources to police services to provide the necessary training and to devote the resources required to address hate crimes. For example, many rural police services

do not have the necessary resources or training to accurately capture - much less address - incidents that are reported to them.

Despite the foregoing, the NCCM takes the position that all police services should be required to report hate crime statistics, as well as the prosecution and conviction rates for each case, to their Police Services Board and to the public. The NCCM also continues to advocate for increased accessibility when it comes to reporting of hate crimes and/or hate incidents by victims, including online options.

As Statistics Canada notes, “according to police services, higher rates of police-reported hate crimes in certain jurisdictions may reflect differences or changes in the awareness, reporting and investigation of these incidents by police and community members.”<sup>3</sup> It is our hope that through the continued advocacy and awareness-raising activities of the NCCM, we will assist police services and other organizations to implement the resources and processes necessary to help reduce the rate of religiously motivated and other associated hate crimes and incidents across the country.

## CONTEXT

### **Quebec mosque shooting**

In 2017, Canadian Muslim communities were left reeling after a shooting at the Islamic Cultural Centre of Quebec on January 29<sup>th</sup> in which six Muslim men were killed and nineteen others were injured, some gravely. The gunman, Alexandre Bissonnette, entered the mosque and opened fire on worshippers as they performed their evening prayers. Bissonnette had expressed clear anti-Muslim and anti-immigrant sentiments prior to carrying out the attack.

This devastating attack colored the experiences of Muslim communities throughout the year that followed, with many individuals and community groups reporting feeling

more fearful about their physical safety in light of the shooting. For Canadian Muslims who reported actual incidents of anti-Muslim discrimination or hate to the NCCM or law enforcement agencies throughout the year, these fears were unfortunately confirmed.

### **Overall increase in hate crimes against Muslims**

It is also important to note that what transpired on January 29<sup>th</sup> was not a standalone or isolated event, but rather cocured against the pre-existing backdrop of increased Islamophobia Canada-wide. A 2017 Angus-Reid poll<sup>4</sup> showed this clearly, with 46% of Canadians reporting feeling that Islam was damaging Canada. This, combined with the general upward trend in documented hate crimes against Muslims in Canada (which increased by 253% from 2012 to 2015 according to Statistics Canada<sup>5</sup>), demonstrates that there is much work to be done to ensure Canadian Muslims not only feel safe, but are capable for full and equal participation.

To illustrate the depth of the problem, in the immediate aftermath of the terrorist attack at the Quebec City mosque which took the lives of six innocent Canadian Muslims, as well as discussion on an Anti-Islamophobia motion at the federal level, the NCCM has noted a spike of hate incidents against Canadian Muslims over the years.

### **Motion 103**

NCCM welcomed the passage in the House of Commons of a motion condemning Islamophobia and all forms of systemic racism and religious discrimination. The motion put forward by MP Iqra Khald urged the government to recognize and condemn the increasing public climate of hate, fear and Islamophobia. NCCM, alongside many civil liberties organizations, released an open letter urging all three level of governments to

take concrete action to counter Islamophobia and all forms of systemic racism and discrimination following the terror attack on the Centre Culturel Islamique de Quebec.<sup>6</sup>

While this motion was a step in the right direction, the unfortunate reality was that the publication of this motion caused a backlash leading to yet more hatred and violence. Iqra Khalid received over 50,000 negative emails, many cornering and attacking her directly after tabling the M103 motion.<sup>7</sup> This severe backlash was reignited when, in early February, the resultant M103 Report, entitled 'Taking Action Against Systemic Racism and Religious Discrimination Including Islamophobia' was released, recommending among other things that January 29 be declared a National Day of Remembrance and Action on Islamophobia. This suggests there is much work to be done in changing the culture of Islamophobia that, quite obviously, still prevails.

### **Rise of the far right**

In 2017, the NCCM continued to witness an increase in the voice and presence of the far right ideology within public discourse and media. This rise appears to have gone hand-in-hand with an increase in anti-Muslim (as well as anti-Black and anti-Semitic) sentiment, ultimately resulting in an increase in hate crimes and incidents of this kind across the country.

The strong connection between the rise of the far right's ideology and anti-Muslim hate was exemplified by the evidence that emerged during the sentencing hearing of Quebec mosque shooter Alexandre Bissonnette. Following a search of Bissonnette's computer, police discovered that in the days leading up to the attack, Bissonnette logged hundreds of online searches for popular right-wing politicians, alt-right media personalities and

internet trolls, and conservative commentators<sup>8</sup>. He also followed a considerable number of far-right personalities on social media who are known for their staunch anti-Muslim views.

In another example from the Peel Region in Ontario, the Peel Regional Police Services issued new findings in an April 2018 report noting a 91% increase in police-reported anti-Muslim hate crimes from 2016 to 2017.<sup>9</sup> The report specifically identified the increased “visibility and voice of far-right extremist groups” as playing a role in the rise of anti-Muslim and other forms of targeted bigotry in the region.<sup>10</sup>

The evidence suggests a causal relationship here between the rise of the far right and increased anti-Muslim hate crimes and incidents, these findings do much to highlight the possible ways in which far-right media activity can serve to embolden those who already hold racist or hateful views to act on those beliefs in increasingly threatening ways.

### **Advocacy on Hate Crimes and Hate Incidents**

The NCCM regularly issues press releases following the reporting of hate crimes or incidents affecting either Canadian Muslims, or members of other minority groups, including, for example, Canadian Jewish and Sikh communities.

These public statements are regularly covered in local, national, and sometimes international media. The NCCM’s aim is to raise awareness around hate crimes/incidents and to encourage victims to come forward to report incidents to their local police services, as well as to the organization itself for documentation purposes.

The NCCM staff regularly provide guidance and support to victims as well as to community leaders whenever a crime or incident is reported. The NCCM also encourages communities to refer to its "[Community Safety Guide](#)" for ways to safeguard their communities from potential hate-motivated harm.

The NCCM also recognizes the critical role community that leaders and elected officials play in standing united and speaking out against xenophobia and manifestations of hate of any kind, against any community. The NCCM regularly calls on our elected officials and leaders to unequivocally condemn acts of hatred, because it recognizes that silence on these issues can cause people who hold racist or xenophobic views to feel justified in those views.

Finally, the NCCM frequently highlights the importance of creating positive, cohesive, and welcoming communities in order to ensure that every citizen feels valued and welcomed, while also understanding not only their rights, but their responsibilities as citizens. Although Canada's model of multiculturalism is regarded as the most successful at promoting harmony and integration, the evidence suggests there is a lot more work to be done.

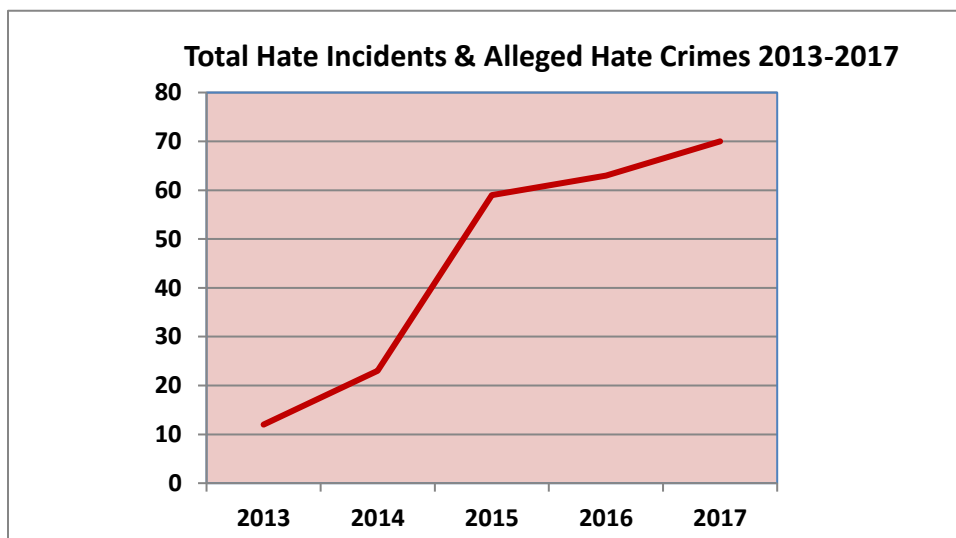
## DISAGGREGATED FIGURES

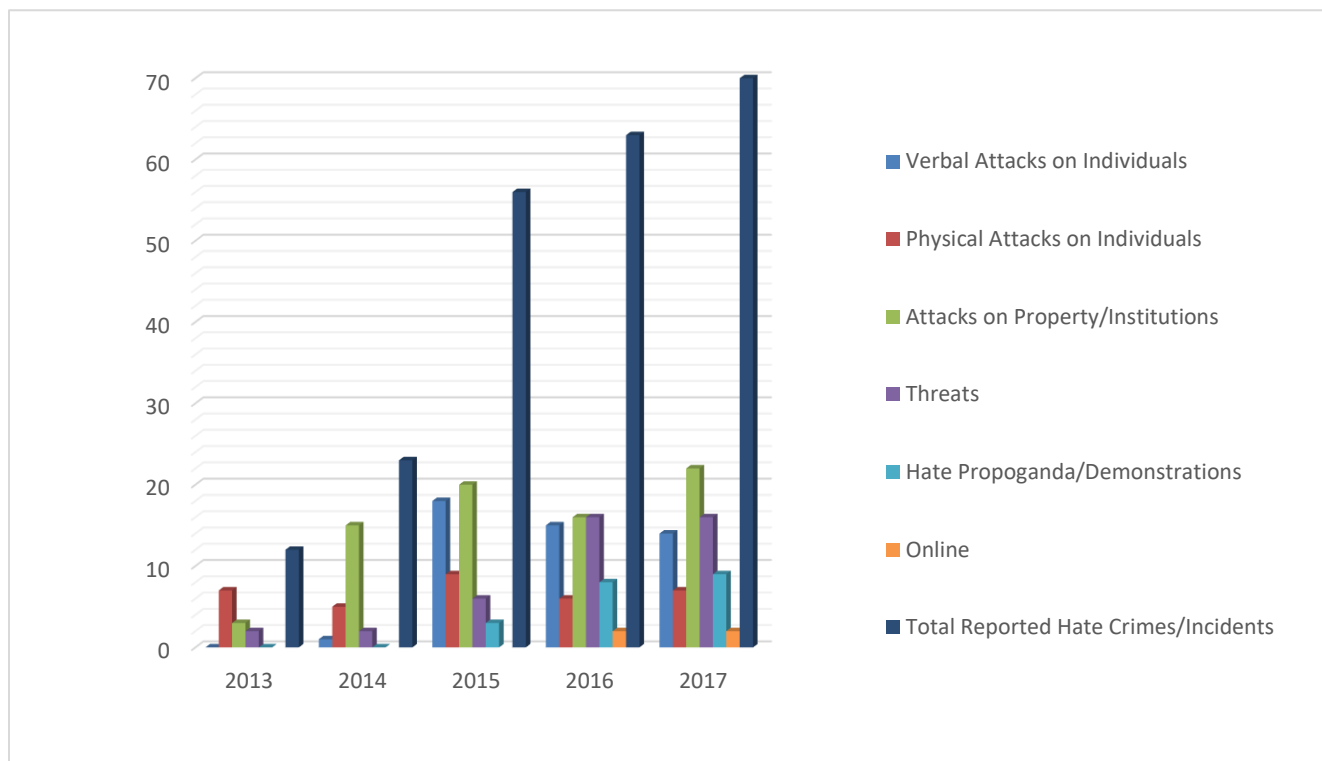
This report references and contains information about 70 hate incidents during 2017 divided as follows:

- 14 verbal attacks on individuals (or groups of individuals)
- 22 attacks on Muslim institutions/property
- 7 physical attacks against individuals (or groups of individuals)
- 16 incidents of threats against individuals (or institutions)
- 9 incidents of hate propaganda against Islam and/or Muslims
- 2 online hate messages against individuals (or groups)

#### 4-YEAR TREND

The incidence of anti-Muslim hate crimes or incidents reported to NCCM, the Police, or in the media has seen a steady increase in 2017. All six categories experienced a gradual increase since 2016. Since 2014, we've seen a significant rise in anti-Muslim incidents from 23 incidents reported to 70 in 2017. This is likely due, in part, to increased awareness regarding the available avenues through which people can report hate, as well as a general increase in the absolute number of hate crimes and incidents taking place.
